SCHOOL NEWS

Aside from academic school work our children have been busy doing some educational sightseeing, and demonstrating to visitors their abilities in the three R's.

Last week our older girls and boys of the 5th, 6th and 8th grades were taken through the "Detroit News," one of Detroit's leading newspapers. Seeing the actual making of a newspaper gave them a much better idea of how it is done than a dozen lectures would have.

At the close of the trip the students were taken through WWJ, the News Radio Station. There they saw actual programs rehearsing. This indeed was an experience they will long remember.

February 7th was a "red letter day" in our school! For it was on that day that all the children attended the Circus at the Fair Grounds. The Detroit Street Railway furnished free bus transportation to and from the fair grounds. For weeks before and weeks afterward the topic of all conversation was the circus. Even the littlest ones thought of nothing else. The antics of the clowns impressed them most for they acted out
