

# Meeting of Educators for the Deaf

On January 11th, the Coordinating Committee on the Education of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing which is composed of the Superintendents and Principals of all residential and day schools for the deaf in Michigan, met in conference at our school. After a consideration of the census blanks, it was suggested that careful instructions should supplement the census blanks so that enumerators have a clear understanding of the specific information desired pertaining to the deaf. It was proposed, also, that procedures should be developed to obtain a more complete reporting of hard of hearing and deaf children through physicians personally and through local, county, and state medical associations. -A committee was appointed to consider the question: What should determine the placement of children in the State School for the Deaf, in the Evangelical Lutheran Institute, and in the day school classes for the deaf and hard of hearing? The committee is to report at the next meeting which is to be held in Grand Rapids, in April.—A matter that the Coordinating Committee is considering is an appraisal of hearing aids that would answer three questions:

- 1. How accessible is the service that is required from time to time?
- What is the experience of teachers with such aids?
- What are the successes of pupils?

Since time did not permit a discussion, consideration was postponed until the Grand Rapids meeting.

The afternoon period was devoted to visiting the classes in our Institute. All members of the committee were greatly impressed with the work done in our school and especially, also, with our well planned buildings and furnishings. Mr. H. Earle Correvont, State Consultant in Education of Exceptional Children, writes, "You and

your staff are to be highly complimented on the fine arrangements made for the meeting of the Coordinating Committee on Thursday, January 11th. A visit through your new buildings was most enjoyable and it is indeed heartening to see what you and your fellow workers have done for the deaf and hard of hearing. The building itself is exceedingly well planned, and you are to be commended for your work in designing and arranging the rooms. The color scheme, the arrangement of furniture and lamps make a charming homelike atmosphere that is indeed pleasing.
