PASTOR'S DEAF SON SUCCEEDS AS MANUFACTURER

Mr. Henry Ford has been very generous in his treatment of the deaf. He has given them employment in many lines of work. Mr. Leo Kuehn, the deaf son of the Rev. E. Kuehn, who had been working for about 12 years as a tool-expert in the Ford plant, desirous of helping others handicapped as himself, told a foreman about his plans. The foreman told Mr. Ford about these plans, and immediately Mr. Ford showed interest in the matter to such an extent that he offered to purchase all the water pump-pulleys Mr. Kuehn could produce, this being the special line of work Kuehn was interested in.

At present 28 deaf men are employed in pump-pulley making in Mr. Kuehn's factory, and they turn out one-half of the water pump-pulleys used on Ford automobiles, that is about 5,000 pulleys daily. Only one person in the plant can hear and speak. He handles telephone calls, etc. He is the child of deaf parents and is

very proficient, as practically all hearing children of the deaf are, in the use of the sign-language.

Mr. Kuehn and his wife as well as the mother of the one hearing person in his plant are graduates of our Lutheran Institute for the Deaf.

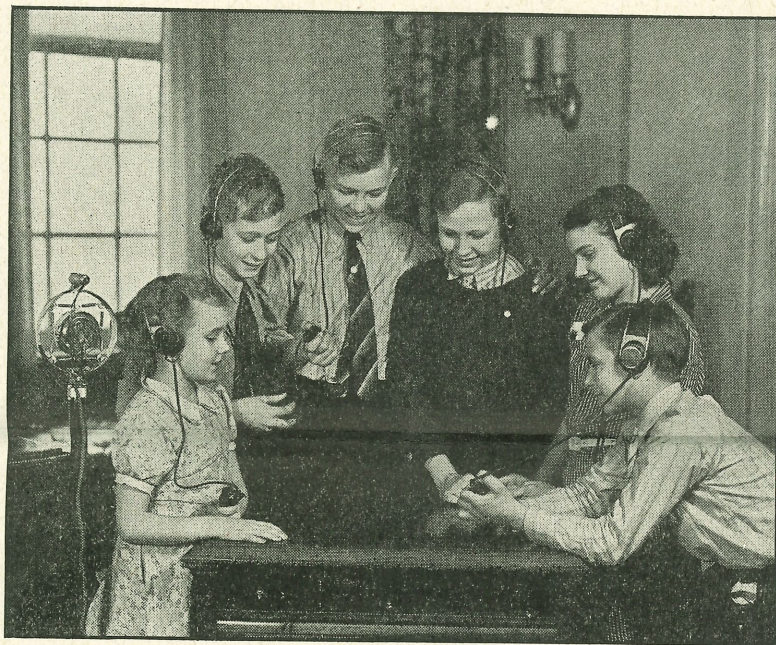

FORMER PUPILS MAKE GOOD IN HEARING HIGH SCHOOLS AND COLLEGE

We are always interested in the educational progress of our former pupils, and it is with great pleasure that we read their letters which reach us from time to time and in which they tell us of their success. It is but natural that most of our graduates continue their education in the State Institutions or Day Schools for the Deaf. However, some of them become so proficient in speech and the art of speech reading that they are able to attend high schools for hearing students. At the present time two of our 1940 graduates are in the 10th grade in high schools for the hearing. They are Anna Nissen of Grant Park, Illinois, and Jerald Jordan of Roseville, Michigan. Another, Irene Allmandinger, who was graduated

from our 8th grade last June, is now attending the 9th grade in a Detroit High School. — Christel Erdman who, after having been confirmed in our school and completed a four-year course in a Chicago high school, is now attending Gauledet College in Washington, D. C. So in spite of their severe handicap, these young people forge ahead. What a lesson for us!

with them.

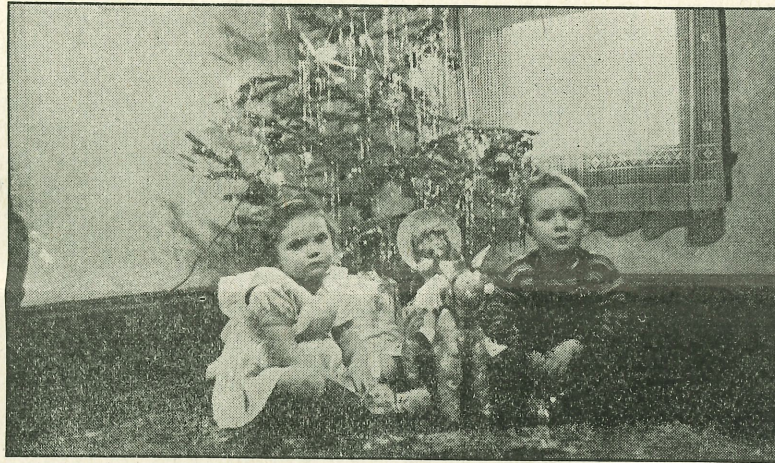
Before long my Christmas vaca-
