Seventy Years Old


Man Proposes, God Disposes

"Three score years and ten ago troit Lutherans decided to do the troit Lut something special for under-privileged children. Thus they conducted their first meeting on February 17, 1873, in order to found an orphans' home at Royal Oak, about ten miles north of the heart of Deroit. The hisory of this home is known: Pastor G. Speckhard was called to be the superintendent. He brought two deaf children with him in order to finish their catechetical instruction. When parents of other deaf children heard of this, they brought them to Pastor Speckhardand by the end of the first year he had twenty deaf children from six States in the "orphans' home." Upon suggestion of Doctor Walther, the few orphans on hand were sent to an orphanage at Addison, Ill., and the Royal Oak home was recognized as the first and only Lutheran and Protestant institute for the deaf to this day.

The early minutes of the association for the institute show that Mr. Strubel was the first chairman and Mr. John Keil the first secretary. The first Board of Directors consisted of the Reverend Huegli, Mr. Strubel, Mr. Beyer, Mr. Walz, Mr. Keil, Mr. Albrecht, Mr. Rehahn, Mr. Jung, and Mr. Berger (no initials are given). The first officers of the association were: President, the Reverend Huegli; Vice-president, Mr. Strubel; Secretary, Mr. Beyer; Treasurer, Mr. Keil; and Cashier, Mr. Rehahn. On March 31, 1873, the resolution was adopted to incorporate the association, and that day was thereafter known as "founders day." Plans were made to erect a new building for the institution. Pastors Moll and Speckhard prepared the campaign literature, and a "regular collector" was engaged to solicit liberal funds "anywhere he might be able to do so, especially in Waldenburg and Roseville," not forgetting Detroit. Pastor Moll was asked to mail the campaign literature to all pastors

Synod. By 1875 the well-known three-story building which was razed in 1939 to make room for the present group of buildings was dedicated with joy and glory to God. The service was conducted on the third Sunday in May, with the Rev. Prof. Hy. Dietrich of Fort Wayne, Ind., delivering the sermon.

sixty-five years or more a group of Lutheran ladies of Detroit have labored and sacrificed for the Institute. At first they collected funds and food for it, walking, and canvassing, and traveling as far as the northern part of Macomb County to bring in a few pennies, and nickels, and dimes, and here and there a pound or a bushel of vegetables and potatoes. Now they sew, and mend, and can, and give of their money for the Institute and for individual children. Throughout the church God

Our Institute for the Deaf, as it | has given us wonderful friends, who is commonly called, has experienced great grace from God. There were dark days. The minutes of the very fourth meeting of the association speak of trouble. There were problems, want, anxiety, gloom, and almost despair. But the Lord always showed us the way out. And He also gave us good friends, who liberally supported the noble cause of our school. At first the managing association consisted of "voting members in any of the congregations in Michigan affiliated with the Synod of Missouri, Ohio, and Other States." (Original governing articles, paragraph 3.) In the course of years this association was changed to one of congregations, so that now it consists of 48 member congregations, which love our Institute and work for it with a joyful spirit. For

readily helped us to build our present plant and who remember us annually with their kind support. This year we have not only been able to meet our current expenses, but also to make our interest payments and to pay off some of our debts. All in all, God has been good to us, our school and its work, our teachers and pupils, our deaconesses and employees, and all who are connected with the Institute; and He has shown us countless examples of splendid fruits of our endeavors in the Christian lives and activities of our graduates in their contact with the world and in their service to the Church.

But we cannot elaborate. Suffice it to say: God has been very good to our Institute by bringing it into being in His providential way, by keeping it these seventy years, and by blessing it continually above our worthiness and expectation to this very day. Glory be to God for His grace! And may He be with us in the days to come, whether they be good or evil, and permit us to serve Him through our Institute for the Deaf more than we have done before! G. ANOTHER HEARING AID

Once more we have been blessed with the gift of a new hearing aid. Our sincere appreciation is extended to Mrs. Caroline Hemmeter, of Detroit, for this most generous present.

Most of our readers are acquainted with the importance of hearing aids in teaching the children in our school. Because these instruments are so valuable in our work, we have set a goal for "A Hearing Aid for Every Classroom." Mrs. Hemmeter, with her generous gift, has carried us over the half-way mark — hers brings our total to six hearing aids. We have eleven classrooms; and we know that through the splendid co-operation and interest of our many good friends, we shall continue to be blessed until we have reached our looming goal.

Our new hearing aid is an "Aurex" which is one of the best instruments of this kind on the market today. It was ordered by Mrs. Hemmeter through the local Aurex representative, Mr. F. W. McKenna, at a cost of \$330.00. Ordinarily this aid would have cost considerably more. However, Mr. McKenna, being a real friend of our Institute and especially of our deaf children, he being hard of hearing himself, donated to our school his entire profit on this sale. The instrument has ten sets of double earphones which are adjustable so that the sound waves will reach both ears at equal intensity, even though the loss of hearing may be greater in one ear than in the other. It is truly a fine instrument and we are very grateful to our kind donor, Mrs. Hemmeter.
