A New Name for a Changing Ministry


At their meeting on January 21, 1988, the board of directors took a historic step by adopting a new name for Lutheran School for the Deaf. To better reflect the changing ministry that has occurred over the past ten years, the Lutheran School for the Deaf will henceforth be referred to as Lutheran School for the Deaf Special Education Ministries.

To clarify this, the corporate name will still remain Lutheran School for the Deaf, but the adopted name, Lutheran School for the Deaf Special Education Ministries, will be used in all publications, letterhead, brochures, etc. for it better reflects how the Lord has opened the door for a changing ministry.

The word Ephphatha, which is used in the name of one of our ministries entitled Ephphatha Institute, means "to be opened." We find in Mark 7 that Jesus used the term Ephphatha when He healed the deaf man. His ears were opened. So, too, has the Lord opened the door for us to enable a new expanded ministry to occur. To this end, the board of directors has also adopted the following Statement of Ministry.

With the knowledge of God's love and the desire that God's love be revealed through our ministry, the Lutheran School for the Deaf Special Education Ministries serves to enable children with special learning needs to receive a Christian education.

You have read, and will continue to read, the stories of children with special learning needs receiving services that help them receive a Christian education. We pray that all our readers and supporters will continue to remember that our ministry is alive and healthy. The number of children receiving instructional services at the close of December, 1987, was 272 children compared with 244 in 1986, and we know that many, many more children will be receiving our services in the future. We thank God for this blessing!

Ephphatha Institute Services


Ephphatha means "be opened." In scripture the term is found in Mark 7:34; it is the word that Jesus spoke when He healed the deaf-mute. The Ephphatha Institute, which "opens" our ministry to hundreds of children, is an arm of the school that provides advisory services. These include curriculum assistance, diagnostic testing, and instructional consultation for children with special learning needs.

The statement of purpose for Ephphatha Institute is to promote the Christian education of children with special learning needs by offering professional evaluation and guidance, thereby fostering the recognition of strengths and the acceptance of weaknesses and enabling children to develop their God-given gifts according to His plan.

If you are a pastor, parish worker, or parent who would especially like assistance on educational or religious materials for a child with unique learning needs such as the hearing impaired, learning disabled, or mentally impaired, feel free to contact us. Our goal is to assist you in providing a quality Christian education to the children you serve.

Lutheran Braille Workers

The Lutheran School for the Deaf Special Education Ministries is very happy to be the home of Work Center #8 for the Lutheran Braille Workers.

Lutheran Braille Workers has grown to a volunteer force of more than 7,000 people working in 191 work centers in the United States, Canada, and Brazil. They work to provide braille and large print Christian materials in over 40 different languages to bring Christ to those in darkness.

Work Center #8 at the school has 99 volunteer workers coming on a daily basis representing 19 area congregations. They recently celebrated their fifth anniversary at a potluck luncheon at Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf at which representatives of Lutheran School for the Deaf Special Education Ministries were guests. One would have had to be present to experience the love, devotion, and peace that is enjoyed by this special group of people.

We are honored and privileged to have such a vibrant ministry within our walls, and we look forward to many years of dedicated cooperation with the Lutheran Braille Workers. We wish them the Lord's every blessing in the days and years ahead as our ministries work in tandem.
