# Serving More Children...In More Ways



How may we serve you? That is one of the questions Lutheran Special Education Ministries (LSEM) continues to ask our friends and ministry partners. In

doing so we believe that more and more doors are opening, and the nportance of Christian special education is becoming even more apparent in our Christian schools and congregations.

Asking the right questions has helped LSEM to meet the changing needs of schools. Here is how we are responding.

## Professional Support

LSEM is reaching out to support Christian teachers who are working with children with special needs. For years we have been providing quality Christian special education teachers to Christian schools so children with special needs have the opportunity to receive a Christ centered education.

But as schools began to hire their own special education teachers, we were at a crossroad and asked the auestion; "How can we help you support children with special learning needs?"

We are excited about developing a new entry-level service; *a national Christian special education professional resource/network*. Our goal is to create a Christian resource for special education that people will feel comfortable accessing and automatically turn to for quality support.

At this entry level, a school or individual teacher will be able to join a network of special education professionals and benefit from our special education information updates and asneeded support.

## Early Childhood Screening

To reach more children at an earlier age LSEM will also be offering early childhood screening. This service will be available for Christian elementary schools and early

childhood centers in areas of the country where LSEM partnership schools are in place.

LSEM is preparing to meet the needs of schools expressing the desire for this service. This service can be used to assess children from preschool through third grade. Screenings enable professionals to monitor children's

progress, to advise parents on how to promote development, and to initiate individualized instruction or any special services that might be needed to facilitate children's learning.

Early childhood screening will give the teachers and the parents valuable information. This will help us to better understand how a child will do in particular subjects within the classroom. The screening will also give us a good idea of how a child compares to children of their same age.

As needs change LSEM will continue to ask the questions that will help us try and meet those needs. Our prayer is that LSEM will keep on serving more children...in more ways!

was called home to be with Jesus on **June 27, 2008**.


