The Arctic Is Cool

Those of us who live in Michigan sometimes feel like we live in the Arctic tundra but the students in my LSEM room at **Trinity Lutheran School in St. Joseph, Michigan** got to experience what it might really be like. Outside in the hallway are pictures of arctic whales attached to lengths of yarn that show how long each whale is. The blue whale string goes all the way down the long hallway and around the corner to the drinking fountain.

In order to get into the **Arctic wonderland** you need to duck down and go through an igloo made of chicken wire and cotton batting. Once inside you see life size replicas of 14 different arctic animals; a 14 foot walrus with his 3 feet long tusks takes up one whole side of the room, while a 10

foot polar bear towers over the doorway, a wolverine sits high up on a book shelf ready to pounce, along with a snowy owl and a snow goose that are suspended from the ceiling.

Doing an inclusive unit each year and living it out in the classroom has many benefits. The number one benefit is that the students love it! Hunter said, "I never knew learning could be so much fun." Caidyn told a new student, "I know it seems like a lot of work now but wait until it is all done. It is so cool!" Another benefit is that it gives these students, who struggle with learning, an opportunity to "show off" their knowledge to their classmates and to their parents. It definitely increases their self confidence. Finally, it brings every student in the school through the LSEM resource room doors at least once a year. They see the resource room as a place where fun learning takes place!

After the Arctic unit was complete the LSEM students were challenged to write about their experience. Ellis wrote, "It was exciting to walk through the igloo and to see all the animals in the room. I liked talking about the Arctic to the kids from our school. I loved all the things I did in the Arctic!" Caidyn wrote, "I learned all about Eskimos and how they like the name Inuits better. Our blubber experiment helped me see how blubber keeps the animals warm." Sarah said, "For our Arctic unit we all did lots of research and preparation so we could teach the whole school about the Arctic. I think that both the teachers and the students enjoyed coming to see our Arctic imita-

tion." Before the reports were even off the walls Jordan asked, "So, what are we doing next year?"

Thank you LSEM school partners and friends for your support that is making it possible for us to make learning fun for everyone.

You are a blessing to me and to the children we serve.
