

Gifted and Talented

As an LSEM teacher, I am passionate about helping children with learning differences. It is very exciting to watch a student with dyslexia become a good reader that loves books. It is rewarding to see a child with a math learning disability find confidence and demonstrate accuracy in problem solving. Helping struggling students succeed is not only a job, it is a calling.

There is another population of children with special learning needs that is sometimes overlooked and that is the gifted and talented student. According to

the Federal definition, the term "gifted and talented" refers to "students who give evidence of high achievement capability in areas such as intellectual, creative, artistic, or leadership capacity, or in specific academic fields, and who need services or activities not ordinarily provided by the school in order to fully develop those capabilities."

There are several options a school has to provide differentiated learning experiences for such students. The existing curriculum can include complexity and offer choices and depth for the gifted student. The LSEM program at St. Paul Lutheran School in Ft. Worth, Texas offers Excel Writing. This is a program for students who have been selected with like needs and abilities out of the regular classroom and meet twice a week for specialized instruction in writing.

Recently, several of the Excel Writing students competed in *PSIA* (*Private School Interscholastic Achievement*) in Fort Worth. St. Paul had several students that won 1st and 2nd place ribbons in Ready Writing and will be going on to compete at the state level competition. The students were required to write on a given topic in 30 to 45 minutes. I am so proud of our young writers! We publish several books written by our Excel Writing students. On the following page there are a few of the poems from our 5th and 6th grade writers.

Without the support of our LSEM partners, programs like Excel Writing would not be possible in many of our Christian schools. I want to personally thank our friends who support the work of these young writers, and so many other children whose lives are changed because of your generosity. God bless you for being a blessing to the children we serve!

It's a new year and a new slate of officers. At a special meeting on January 13, 2011 the LSEM Board of Trustees elected new officers. We welcome **Susan Vogt** as our new Chair, **Peter Rynearson** as our new Vice-Chair, and **Karen Russell** as our board Secretary. All three bring unique skills and expertise to the board that will enhance our services.

The transition of LSEM from a deaf school to an organization that serves children with special learning needs in schools and congregations has been slow. Did you know that in 1975, that's about 35 years ago, we began supporting more than just children with hearing impairments? And in 1991 our name was changed to LSEM because there were an increasing number of children with disabilities other than hearing impaired?

Our outreach to children last year numbered over 2,400 spanning the United States. Our transition is continuous, and in order for LSEM to continue to support this special population of children, we must continue to change to meet the needs. This is no easy task!

Children with special needs are easily over

looked in times of economic down turns. Christian Schools are having difficulty staying open and school boards can't justify the extra expense for special education programs. LSEM is looking for new ways to support, as Jesus said, "a child like this," without putting a burden on Christian schools or congregations, and we need your help.

It's budget time so I am doing some calculating. I figured, if all our friends who receive "The Advocate", approximately 11,000, made a \$200 donation this year it would equal \$2,200,000. Likewise, if our friends, asked ten friends, to give a \$100 donation, that would generate a whopping \$11,000,000! With that kind of support, budget time would be a cinch and LSEM could provide quality special education programs to 165 Christian schools at absolutely no cost. Even better, we could help more than 10,600 children who have special learning needs. Incredible!

At LSEM we believe that all gifts large and small will make a difference in the life of a child. As God leads, I pray that you will continue to partner with us in our mission. I am trusting that God will provide what is needed when it's needed. God is good...all the time!

I am Gus; watch my splash as I paddle through the hot tub.


I am Gus; hear me, see me, but watch out!
