This year we are excited to tell you about our newest endeavor through our I CAN Learning Center. Through the I CAN Learning Center, LSEM is reaching out and partnering with churches and their members in large city communities, and serving children from lower income families who have little or no resources.

Our first program is taking place at **Charity Lutheran Church in Detroit, MI.** The program started with 7 students and has grown to over 20 in just a few short weeks. The students are not only growing academically, they are experiencing the love of **Jesus** that will have a lasting impact!

In the hustle and bustle of moving our national office I was reminded that this wasn't our first move. Mr. Larry Uhlig reminded me that his great-grandfather, Herman Uhlig, Director of the ministry moved to the Nevada Street site in 1875 to then Norris, Michigan (now Detroit) from their Royal Oak, MI home. It took a community of smiling volunteers and 15 teams of horses. They moved to accommodate more children to know Jesus. For this same reason we moved to get out of the way so Cornerstone School can serve more children in their new high school.

Our new national office is located in Farmington Hills, MI. During the moving process I prayed about preserving the memory of yesterday and just like in 1875 God gave us a community of volunteers. That community of volunteers needs to grow today. We need help to preserve the past, to care for the over 3,000 children per year being helped in the present and to reach out to the future.

Moving forward and looking to the future, I invite you to be a part of our community. Visit our website for giving and serving opportunities. The only way we have been able to provide quality programs to families, schools, churches, and communities is through your support. Our current operation expenses are higher than our income. Is this bad business or a ministry that reaches to serve first and relies on God to move in the hearts of His people. Our short fall figures out to about \$2,040 per week.

As a Christ-centered resource that supports children with learning needs, we take what we have from the past and continue to create quality Christian programs. One such program is highlighted on the front page. The I CAN Learning Center reaches out to all children with learning needs. We have been reaching out with quality support for children with learning needs one year at a time, for 139 years, with hope and faith in God that we will be reaching out again next year.




A poster advertising the 100th annual Lutheran School for the Deaf Festival! 1873-1973

Now a middle school student, Nick has always struggled in school. He was one of those students who we knew had a lot of potential if we could just find the right ways to motivate him and help him learn," said his LSEM teacher. It was evident early on that Nick was on his own when it came to school. He didn't receive a lot of positive reinforcements from home and he was belittled for having to receive extra support at school. He would also get punished for not being able to accomplish work on his own. As is often the case, Nick began to believe that he was hopeless, useless, and stupid, but Nick never gave up!

The school staff never gave up on Nick either. Nick's LSEM teacher, his classroom teacher, and the principal would meet often to discuss strategies to

address his learning challenges. If it worked they would move on to another problem. If it didn't they would rethink it. They would always remind Nick that he could never give up because they would never give up on him.

It wasn't easy but after several months of working with Nick his anger began to diminish and late and incomplete assignments became less frequent. He began to ask more questions and volunteering answers. The last semester in school Nick made the honor roll. He was so surprised that he questioned the teacher on how his math score was figured. Once he was convinced that he had actually earned his good grades he could not conceal his happiness!

The LSEM teacher at Nick's school reminds us that even though Nick is doing well he still has to work really hard to accomplish what many of his classmates do easily. He still comes to the resource room for help but at times he slips back into his "I'm hopeless" mode and needs a boost. We are thankful that God has provided for the LSEM program at Nick's school through friends like you. Your support helps Nick and students like him grow and know that they are valued and loved.
