
I also have a 3rd grade student that has been struggling to write and get her thoughts down on paper since last year. She will usually write as little as she must get her work finished.

## Now Stories!



This year, he has been excited to be able to complete AR (Accelerated Reader) comprehension tests online for books he's read, just like his classmates. There are posters in the school library celebrating when students in the school reach certain lifetime milestones in their AR goals, with the first milestone being when they reach 50 points. Usually, the goal is 10 points per quarter.

I am elated to say that, for the first time ever, this young man just hit 50 lifetime points and is over the moon to be featured on the poster in the library like his peers!

Seeing his name on that poster made him so proud and giddy — you couldn't help but smile watching him. It has been such a gift to be able to support and assist this young man and I am so proud of all the time and energy he's put into strengthening his reading ability!




The Founders' Circle recognizes donors who have enriched the Ministry through lifetime gifts of \$25,000 and above.
